Steve Massey the SMDC tree officer was visiting the property on Wednesday so the Cllrs Flunder and Herdman would be available for the meeting.

Cllr Yates returned.

A local resident queried about the double yellow lines at the bottom of Caverswall Road, and how long it would be before they were installed. The Clerk explained that the legal order had been out for consultation and we await more information. The Clerk will ask County Cllr Ward for an update.

Black Cock Football Team - Complaint

Letter of complaint from the Black Cock FC the Clerk had previously circulated the letter of complaint to the Councillors. The main issue was that the team felt that the fees for the past season were not commensurate with the facility they were renting. There had been damage to the side lines of the pitch by an animal. The Clerk had asked to see proof of where any games had been asked to be called of by a referee but nothing had been received yet. The rent was due on the 31.03.2022 and the Councillors were concerned that none of the issues had been communicated at the point they had happened. The Council also needed clarity over who the manager of the Team was as the Clerk had been lead to believe it was someone different then who had written the letter of complaint.

Councillor Yates proposed that no reduction in fees be allowed. Vote for not This was seconded by Cllr Felin.

A show of hands was Unanimous for no reduction in fees.
